OIL COOLER BRACKET

This bracket was designed to try to eliminate the cracking of the oil cooler flanges. Some builders and George already have had problems with such cracks. On my airplane, I used 1/8"-6061-T6 AL plate for the brackets construction. I used four (4) cord mount #150-PLN-10 suited on a main frame bolted with four (4) special spacers made of 3/4" AL, shafting taking the place of the 3/8 nuts securing the governor cover on the back case. The oil cooler is then fixed to another frame which is bolted to the lord mounts.

Layout the bracketson taper before cutting anything. I tried to be careful in making the sketch but---

NOTE: Do not bolt the oil cooler on one (1) flange only, used spacers in between both flanges to get a tight mounting without damaging the oil cooler.
